Control of the initial level of knowledge by conducting a test of 5 questions - 10 min. 3. Work in small groups and analysis of the content of the topic of the lesson - 55 min. 4. Checking abstracts - 15 min 5. Conclusion and homework - 5 min.
Organization of the lesson according to the method TBL	In one classroom several small groups of 8-10 students are formed. TBL is generally characterized by three main components: - a high degree of self-training of the student; - individual or team screening tests; - most of the study time is devoted to the implementation of team practical tasks based on decision-making. The purpose of choosing the team-oriented method of Team Based Learning (TBL) is to increase the activity of students.
Final part	Summarizing the lesson. Homework for the next lesson.
