Week 3 – Back to school: Setting goals for the year

Discipline: Conversational English

Theme: Back to school – Setting goals for the year

Lesson Objectives

- recall and use school-related vocabulary.
- Apply goal-setting phrases in sentences.
- Create personal goals for the school year.

Stage	Time	Activity & Teacher's Role	Students' Role / Resources
Warm-up	5 min	Teacher asks: 'What do you want to achieve this year?'	Students share ideas
Vocabulary	10 min	Teacher introduces words: goal, improve, achieve, success, challenge, plan.	Repeat, copy Flashcards
Listening	15 min	Teacher plays short text: 'My goal this year is to read more books'.	Identify goals Audio
Speaking	20 min	Pair-work: discuss goals with a partner.	Interview partner Worksheet
Reading	15 min	Teacher gives text about setting goals.	Read and answer questions
Wrap-up	10 min	Teacher asks: 'What is one important goal for you?'	Answer
Homework	5 min	Write a list of 5 personal goals for this year.	

Reading Text

It is September and students are back to school. Many of them feel excited about the new year. At the beginning of the year, it is good to set goals. Some students want to improve their English. Others want to read more books or write better essays. Sports goals are also popular, for example, joining the football team. Teachers also set goals: to help students learn, to make lessons interesting, and to give useful feedback. A goal can be small or big, but it must be clear. Listening	15 min	Teacher plays audio about online classes.	Identify advantages \disadvantages Audio
Reading	15 min	Teacher gives text about education systems.	Read and compare Text
Speaking	20 min	Group discussion: 'Do you prefer traditional or online learning?'	Share ideas Worksheet
Creative task	10 min	Teacher asks to design an 'ideal school' with technology.	Create poster notes Paper
Wrap-up	10 min	Teacher asks: 'What technology is most useful for students?'	Answer
Homework	5 min	Write a short essay: 'How technology helps me study'.
